Homelessness: what can we do to help?

Saturday 8th February 10am - 3pm

Meet the different agencies working across the city to address homelessness, and find out how best the public can help. There will be information about volunteering, giving and how to respond.

Real life stories of homelessness will be told through a 'living library', whereby visitors to the Cathedral can spend time with people who have been homeless and find out first-hand about their experience.

The Knitted House will be on display in the Cathedral from February 7 - 24, made of 4,677 scarves, each one representing a rough sleeper in the UK.

Children's activities will be running throughout the day.

At 2pm, local author Robert Ashton will talk about his latest book, *Any Spare Change?*, which documents his quest to understand the issue of homelessness and how the public can help.

At 3.30pm there will be a special act of worship around The Knitted House.
